It can change due to context and time.</p> <p>→ People in situations of vulnerability may include e.g. poor, residents in informal settlements & slums, persons facing – or at risk facing – forced evictions, homeless persons, children, youth, elderly, persons with disabilities, displaced persons, refugees and migrants, indigenous peoples, minorities, people living with HIV/AIDS, persons of diverse sexual orientations and gender expressions, as well as women in all these categories.</p>	<p>Identifying the entitlements of rights-holders and the obligations of duty-bearers enables a Capacity Gap Analysis and for strengthening capacities.</p> <p>→ Individuals and groups with valid human rights claims are rights-holders.</p> <p>→ State and non-state actors with correlative obligations are duty-bearers.</p>	<p>The Capacity Gap Analysis demonstrates why a right is not realized or at risk of not being realized.</p> <p>→ Programmes should assess the capacity gaps of rights-holders to claim their rights and the capacity gaps of duty-bearers to meet their obligations.</p> <p>→ Strategies should be developed to reduce or eliminate these capacity gaps.</p>
